In the pink!

PALE PINKS

Bubble-gum is a big trend for 2021 and it is already filtering down to the high street in stores such as New Look, River Island and H&M. Pale, dusky pinks can be found in many loungewear sets this season. Gone are the old, grey joggers and in are the pastel colours. Pastel pink doesn't have to be girly and you can add an edge by wearing it with grey or navy. In particular, pale pink looks great with snake print. These colours work well for those with fair skin tones.

ORANGEY PINKS

More subtle, summery shades of pink include salmon, coral and peachy pinks. This colour works well if you want to dip your toe in the water, without going all out *Legally Blonde*. Salmon and coral pinks work well on those with warmer skin tones and it's a colour that lends itself well to leopard print. If you have a warm skin tone, try soft peach or coral nails.

BOLD PINKS

For impact, choose bright and vibrant pink shades, such as watermelon, fuchsia, neon, hot pink and cerise. These look great with all hair colours, including on redheads who often avoid pink. Vibrant, impactful pinks also look fabulous on those with very dark hair. Hot pinks can be colour blocked with cobalt blue, deep purple and even acid green. If you are nervous about trying a bold colour, test it out with a hot pink pair or shoes or a bag.
